Christmas, there was a time that for many children, Christmas is the highlight time of the year. It is now with a few exceptions (and when it comes to Santa Claus in December 1975) that time seems so distant. Santa has a different meaning today.

How did that happen? The Forgotten Children's Fund has given a group of dedicated volunteers the first gift of Christmas through the gift of sharing.

Every year PCF volunteers work together to purchase, wrap and deliver gifts to needy children and their families. From our own small communities, cash can help us provide toys for needy children and because of supplier relationships, each dollar represented is stretched across a nation.

All children receive gifts, clothing and warm winter coats. The gifts are delivered to volunteer homes and then on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Children are selected on the basis of need. Typically, the homes we help are sponsored by other public or charitable organizations. Early funds in connection to disaster relief are made along with money and gifts of such kind. In some cases, help is made beyond parents' immediate means, but no ability required.
